The Centre for Women's Condensed Course is a private girls only school coaching students of classes VIII to XII and functioning from Jamia Middle School building. The students of class X and class XII appear for the Secondary and Senior Secondary examination of Jamia Millia Islamia as private candidates. They are offered regular subjects like Hindi, English, Maths, Science, Social Science and Islamiyat upto class X and Arts stream in class XI & XII.

ABOUT THE SCHOOL

Its vision and aim

The Centre for Women's Condensed Course (CWCC) was conceived in the year 1986 under the aegis of Dr. Zakir Husain Memorial Welfare Society with a vision to educate girls, help them in completing basic school education and equip them to pursue higher education.

Running successfully for over 34years, the Centre has grown and flourished in its journey in imparting education.

Our aim at CWCC is to keep the flame of knowledge burning and let it's light reach the darkest corners of society. Girls who would otherwise have been left out of the ambit of education due to social and economic hurdles are given a chance to study in a healthy and motivated environment.

Curricular Activities:

- **School timings- 1:30pm to at 5:30pm.**
- **7 periods daily of duration30 minutes each.**
- **Qualified and experienced teachers to teach subjects.**
- **Discussions, demonstrations, experimentions and discovery methods are being applied.**
- **Online classes during covid using innovative teaching methods.**

- **Offline mode includes various teaching learning material through PPT and other ICT methods.**
- **Remedial teaching for slow learners.**

Co-curricular Activities;

Activities and programmes are conducted throughout the year for all-round development in which students participate and exhibit immense talent.

Students excelling in academics are given prizes and scholarships.

Exposure of students to other activities:

Teacher trainees from the B.Ed. department (TTI) and the Fine Arts department of Jamia Millia Islamia are sent to the Centre every year for a month of teaching practice. Students interact with these trainees during classroom learning as well as through fun filled activities with immense enthusiasm.

NCC: Students of CWCC can enroll themselves for NCC in Jamia.

Students' Counselling

The Centre has counsellor from Sangath, a voluntary organisation, for students in need of counselling. They conducted online counselling sessions and sensitization programmes with teachers and parents through webinars during covid pandemic.
